EARLY CAREER FORUM

This day-long workshop at ENDO 2023 connects early career professionals with today's leading endocrinology experts to gain new tools and perspectives.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be an Endocrine Society member.
- 2. Must be a fellow in an endocrinology training program, basic science postdoctoral fellow, graduate student in a PhD granting program, or medical student in an MD granting program.
- 3. In-person attendance at ENDO is required.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 6, 2023

OUTSTANDING ABSTRACT AWARD

These awards recognize outstanding abstracts that have been accepted for presentation at ENDO, our annual meeting.

CRITERIA:

- Must be a graduate or medical student, in-training postdoctoral or clinical fellow, or new faculty within 1 or 2 years of appointment.
- 2. Preference is given to Endocrine Society members.
- 3. Must submit an abstract to ENDO 2023 and attend the meeting in person.

C. WAYNE BARDIN, MD, INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL AWARD

This award was created in honor of Dr. Wayne Bardin, who made remarkable research contributions to both reproductive physiology and contraception throughout his long career.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be an endocrine fellow currently in training or a junior faculty member for less than 5 years.
- 2. Must submit an abstract to ENDO 2023 and attend the meeting in person.
- 3. Awardee will be considered from the international community as defined by residence outside of the USA, with emphasis on select candidates from countries with emerging economies. Candidates from the USA could be considered under unusual circumstances.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 17, 2023

EARLY INVESTIGATORS AWARD

These awards provide monetary support to assist in the development of early career investigators and recognition of their accomplishments in areas of general endocrinology.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be a member of the Endocrine Society.
- 2. Hold an MD, PhD, or MD/PhD
- 3. Be a third or forth year post-doctoral fellow or a newly appointed faculty within 10 years from the terminal degree granting date
- 4. Only one nomination per research mentor
- 5. Encouraged to write an article for a future edition in *Endocrine News* and/or volunteer for other opportunities within the Endocrine Society. Travel awards require in-person attendance at ENDO.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 6, 2023

EUGENIA ROSEMBERG Abstract travel award

These travel grants are awarded to outstanding abstracts in the basic science category by early career professionals presented during ENDO.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be junior faculty/early career professional within 3 years of completing a PhD or MD/PhD training program.
- 2. Open to any abstract submitted in the Basic Science Categories.
- 3. Must attend ENDO in person. The program is not available virtually.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 17, 2023

MARA E. LIEBERMAN Memorial travel grants

These travel grants are awarded to outstanding abstracts submitted by women in honor of Mara E. Lieberman to present their research during ENDO.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be a female graduate student, in-training postdoctoral fellow, or new faculty within 1-2 years of appointment.
- 2. Must submit an abstract to ENDO 2023 as the first or presenting author and attend the meeting in person.

RESEARCH EXPERIENCES FOR GRADUATE AND MEDICAL STUDENTS (REGMS)

REGMS supports promising medical and graduate students who have demonstrated commitment to endocrine research and expressed interest in enhancing their professional development skills.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be active members in the Endocrine Society for the duration of the program.
- 2. Must be a full-time student and may not be employed as a research assistant.
- 3. Academic level must fall into one of the following categories:
 - First or second year graduate students
 - First year medical students
- 4. Must participate in the summer webinar series and in-person attendance at the following ENDO

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JANUARY 6, 2023

FUTURE LEADERS ADVANCING RESEARCH IN ENDOCRINOLOGY (FLARE)

FLARE provides structured leadership development to basic science and clinical research trainees, and junior faculty from underrepresented minority communities who have demonstrated achievement in endocrine research.

CRITERIA:

- 1. Endocrine Society in-training member
- 2. Currently enrolled in a US graduate program, post-doctoral fellowship, an endocrine clinical fellowship, or junior faculty (within 1-3 years of obtaining first faculty position)
- 3. Of an ethnic minority group underrepresented in the biomedical sciences (African American, Hispanic American, American Indian or Native American, Alaska Native, and Natives of the US Pacific Islands)
- 4. US citizen or US permanent resident

EXCELLENCE IN CLINICAL ENDOCRINOLOGY LEADERSHIP (EXCEL)

ExCEL offers comprehensive leadership training and mentorship to early career physicians of communities underrepresented in medicine and science.

CRITERIA:

- 1. An Endocrine Society in-training member.
- 2. Currently enrolled in an accredited US endocrinology fellowship program
- Of an ethnic minority group underrepresented in medicine and science (African American, Hispanic American, American Indian or Native American, Alaska Native, and Natives of the US Pacific Islands)
- An early career professional with an expressed interest in pursuing careers in clinical practice/ clinical care settings
- 5. An early career professional who aspires to leadership positions that make a difference in their profession and communities
- 6. US citizen or US permanent resident
